

Over the years, many MIM core teaching and training activities (seminars, classes...) have been entrusted to a number of external teachers/lecturers/trainers. The new two-year MIM course intends to maintain and reinforce this successful collaboration pattern, and the MIM Consortium is now seeking the collaboration of high profile, external scholars. Applications are welcomed for the following area of expertise:

(1) Contemporary Lebanon and Palestinian Refugees

Application requirements:

- Deep knowledge of contemporary political issues in Lebanon, both at social and political level, with particular emphasis on the role played by regional powers in the country since its independence. A specific knowledge of the situation of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon is required;
- Extensive fieldwork experience, in particular with Palestinian refugees;
- Experience in lecturing and supervising students on the history and politics of contemporary Lebanon at university level. The candidate must have contributed to his field of specialisation as evidenced by a sound publication record;
- A continuous participation to conferences and seminars at national and international level is an advantage;
- Very good knowledge of English, French and Arabic

Applicants are invited to send to the MIM Secretariat (mim-plus-master@unive.it), via e-mail and not later than **6 November 2017** :

- An updated CV (Europass format)
- A cover letter with the applicant's track record and a proposal of the foreseen teaching activities (objectives, content, methodology, tools), including a description of the added value which the applicant intends to bring to the programme with respect to student-centered teaching/lecturing, research activities and academic/professional networking.

Applications will be evaluated by the MIM Governing Board on the basis of qualifications and professional experience, as well as publications and participation to international lectures. No weighting will be applied to these criteria. The selected applicant will be expected to teach a seminar of 1 week at the Ca' Foscari University of Venice in January, February or March 2018. A "week" is defined as minimum of 4 out of 7 consecutive calendar days and may include travelling time. The MIM Consortium will cover travel and accommodation expenses throughout the stay, and will additionally offer a remuneration that will be negotiated on a case-by-case basis with the successful applicant.

All applicants will receive a confirmation (via email) that their application has been received. However, the selection results will be notified only to the successful candidate.

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(2) Political Demography in the Arab World

Application requirements:

- Deep knowledge of demographic patterns in the Middle East and Northern Africa, and their social, economic, political and cultural implications. Familiarity with both Maghreb and Mashreq countries is an advantage;
- Experience in lecturing and supervising students in the area of political demography at university level. The candidate must have contributed to his field of specialisation as evidenced by a sound publication record;
- Extensive fieldwork experience;
- continuous participation to conferences and seminars at national and international level is an advantage;
- Very good knowledge of English, French and Arabic.

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(3) Contemporary Libya/ Violence/ History of Libya

Application requirements:

- PhD in Political science or related fields;
- Very good knowledge of English or French (the languages of instruction)
- Experience in lecturing on social and political changes in Libya and on the violence outbreaks in countries with an economy based on oil revenues;
- Experience in scientific research and in supervising students researching on violence within Islam, on contemporary Libya and on political reforms in the Maghreb region;
- Work experience at Euro-Mediterranean institutions/organisations and/or in related networks.

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
